Safe for Use - Official

The European Union has completed and published the risk assessments of the vinyl plasticisers Di-‘isononyl’ phthalate (DINP) and Di-‘isodecyl’ phthalate (DIDP).

Phthalate plasticisers DINP and DIDP:

- ✓ can be safely used in current vinyl applications
- ✓ pose no risk in any of their current uses
- ✓ are not classified as hazardous substances

You and the plastics industry:

- ✓ can continue to use DINP and DIDP with the utmost confidence
- ✓ can now prepare for the future with plasticisers that are Ready for REACH

The risk assessments results represent the conclusion of a **comprehensive scientific evaluation** conducted by EU regulators under the Existing Substances Regulation (EC/793/93). After 10 years of research, the results provide a clear message that DINP and DIDP can be safely used.
